PORTFOLIO DESCRIPTION AND INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

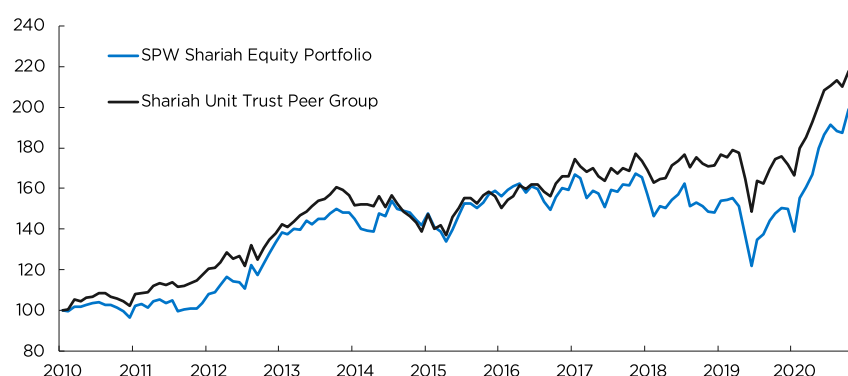

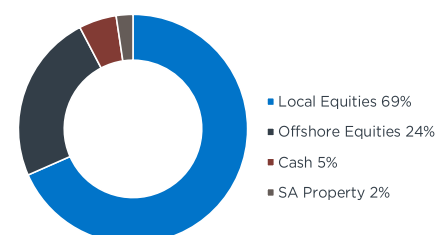

PORTFOLIO MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The extreme diversity in the performance of investment styles and across geographies was very visible in the performance of headline indices during the month. SA equities, as measured by the FTSE/JSE All Share Index (ALSI), recorded a negative total return in rand of 1.7%. This negative return is in stark contrast to the 2.5% US dollar advance in global equities (MSCI World Equity Index) and even a firm 2.6% return from its emerging market peers. The star performer on the global equity stage was the Nasdaq Index that gained 4.3% as the enthusiasm for information technology shares continued unabated.

The negative return by the ALSI was driven largely by mining shares that came under pressure as commodity prices pulled back from elevated levels. The mining sector declined by 10.9% as shares sold off across base metal and precious metal miners. The other big loser was Naspers/Prosus, as investors took a dim view on regulatory changes in China. The technology sector lost 12% of its value. So-called SA Inc shares were the big winners in the month. Banks gained 15.3%, life assurers advanced by 12.2%, and healthcare and pharmacare traded 8.2% and 8.4% higher respectively.

SA bond prices were firm, adding 1.7% in the month, and cash yielded a return of 0.3%. Listed property shares resumed their upward trend with a total gain of 7.5% in the month.

The Shariah portfolio returned 0.13% (benchmark: 1.07%) in August. The underperformance of the portfolio relative to the benchmark was driven largely by the negative performance of the mining shares. No changes were made to the portfolio during the month.
