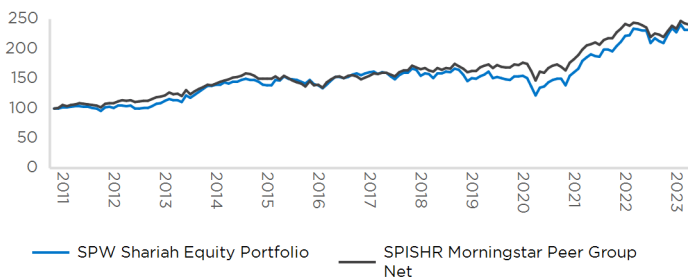
### YOUR PERSONAL EQUITY PORTFOLIO

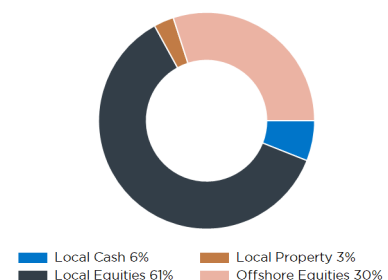

## PORTFOLIO MANAGER'S COMMENTS

April was a fairly calm month in financial markets after the volatility experienced in March. Global equities, as measured by the MSCI World Index, returned 1.8%, while global bonds returned 0.4%. Emerging market equities underperformed, falling 1.1%, dragged lower by the 5.2% decline in MSCI China.

Commodities were generally on the back foot, with Brent crude oil declining 0.3%, despite OPEC's decision to cut supply during the month. Copper declined 5.5% while gold continued its rise, adding another 1.1% in US dollar terms.

Expectations for the future interest rate path by the US Federal Reserve increased during the month as core inflation across the developed world remained sticky and well above the central banks' target ranges.

South African equities, as measured by the FTSE/JSE All Share Index, rose 3.4% in rand terms in April, but were up only 0.2% in US dollars as the rand weakened. Our gold and platinum miners rallied, with Goldfields and Amplats rising 19.9% and 13.6% respectively. Tobacco (+7.2%), healthcare providers (+6.7%) and personal goods (+6.4%) also performed strongly. Forestry and paper (-9.3%) as well as the diversified miners Anglo American (-4.3%) and BHP (-4.2%) were a drag on the index performance.

The SPW Shariah portfolio returned 3.19% (benchmark: 3.08%) in April. During the month, we reduced our weighting in Goldfields and Impala Platinum and took a new position in Northam.
